MIS END ITEM HANDLING CODE

Description: The MIS end item handling code.

Number of Characters: 1

Type of Code: ALPHA/NUMERIC

CODE	DEFINITION/EXPLANATION
E	Bin. Any end items stored in an automated or mechanized bin areas, non-mechanized bin areas, and package racks within bin areas.
F	Medium Bulk. Any end items which are stored in a pallet rack location in bulk areas or in bulk warehouse locations and are processed in less than truckload receipts/shipments or full truckload receipt/shipments or full truckload receipt/shipments of single, easy-to-handle commodity.
G	Heavy Hazardous. Any end item lines of materiel received or issued that are considered more difficult to process. Any end item lines of materiel received or issued due to its quantity, concentration, or physical, chemical, or infectious characteristics, may either cause or significantly contribute to an incapacitating illness; or pose a substantial present or potential hazard to human health or the environment when improperly treated, stored, transported, disposed of, or otherwise manage.

CODE	DEFINITION/EXPLANATION
H	<u>Combat Vehicle.</u> Any self propelled, fully tracked vehicle. Examples include armored personnel carriers (M113, M577, M-2/3 Bradley), tanks (M-1, M60), recovery vehicles (M88), self-propelled artillery (SP 155mm, 120mm), and special purpose vehicles, such as the combat engineer vehicle (CEV, bulldozers), and armored bridging vehicles (AVLB).
J	<u>Trailers.</u> Any wheeled trailer or any equipment permanently mounted on a wheeled trailer, excluding artillery. Examples include trailer-mounted generators, flatbed trailers, and utility trailers that support tactical vehicles.
K	<u>Tactical Vehicles.</u> Any self-propelled wheeled vehicle. Example include jeeps (HUMMV, M151, trucks (2.5 tons, 5 ton), wheeled engineer equipment (backhoe).
L	<u>Small Arms.</u> Individual or crew served weapons. Examples include pistols (9mm, etc.), rifles (M16, Squad Automatic Weapon), and machine guns (M60, 50 caliber).
M	<u>Towed Artillery.</u> Any artillery/anti-aircraft piece that is mounted on a wheeled carriage and requires a tactical or wheeled vehicle for movement. Example is the 105mm howitzer.
N	<u>Aircraft.</u> Any piece of equipment capable of flight. Examples include helicopters, fixed wing aircraft, and remotely piloted reconnaissance aircraft.
P	<u>Oversize.</u> Any extremely large item. Example is a boat.
Q	<u>Combat Vehicles.</u> (Unserviceable)
R	<u>Tactical Vehicles.</u> (Unserviceable)
S	<u>Trailers.</u> (Unserviceable)

CODE	DEFINITION/EXPLANATION
T	<u>Trailers Mounted/Oversize.</u> (Unserviceable)
U	<u>Category 1, Other.</u> (Miscellaneous Unserviceable) (i.e. Cages for MLRS carriers, boat cradles for truck, any items that normally do not contain wheels or track).
V	<u>Category 2, Other.</u> (Reimbursable Class VII MEI)
W	<u>Towed Vehicles, Unserviceable.</u>
X	<u>Small Arms, Unserviceable.</u>
